Every Child Safe, Healthy and Connected

CESA #4 is the fiscal agent and houses the WISH Center Director. Four Regional Coordinators located in CESAs #6, #7, #9, and #10 facilitate training events and provide technical assistance on a variety of safe and healthy schools topics.

Trainings were held in all 12 CESAs and online from July 1, 2016 to June 30, 2017. One thousand five hundred thirty-two educators were trained in:

- Active Students are Better Learners
- Educating Mindfully
- Emerging Drug Trends
- Helping Students Through Trauma and Loss
- Honest, Open, Proud Mental Health Facilitator Training
- Just in Time
- My Sexual Health: My Future
- Restorative Practices
- School Safety (PREPaRE)
- School SBIRT
- Suicide Prevention, and
- Youth Mental Health First Aid

Participants were from 216 school districts, eight private schools, and 54 individuals or organizations. Technical assistance was offered by email, phone, and through partnerships with CESAs holding share-shops/networking meetings in every region.

Nineteen school districts participated in School SBIRT training and all received follow-up coaching for implementation.

There were 9,315 unique visitors to the website in the last year. The monthly newsletter had 5,180 unique opens. Two online AODA classes with 20 participants from

18 schools and organizations were offered. With Federal Emergency

Management funding through the Department of Public Instruction (DPI), nine PREPaRE trainings, a regional Readiness and Emergency Management training, and a Resiliency Trainer of Trainers workshop were held.
