
"Every Child Safe, Healthy and Connected" Report Summary

- ★ CESA #4 is the fiscal agent and houses the WISH Center Director. Four Regional Coordinators located in CESAs #6, #7, #9, and #10 facilitate training events and provide technical assistance on a variety of safe and healthy schools topics.
- ★ Trainings were held in all 12 CESAs and online. Eight-hundred ninety-one educators were trained in Educating Mindfully, Emerging Drug Trends, Youth Mental Health First Aid, Restorative Practices, Second Step, Suicide Prevention, School Safety (PREPaRE), and School SBIRT. Participants were from 170 school districts and 56 individuals or organizations. See the Participant Map below.
- ★ Technical assistance was offered by email, phone, and through partnerships with CESAs holding Shareshops/networking meetings in every region. We provided technical assistance to 2,706 people. 712 youth, school staff, and community members were trained in QPR Gatekeeper (Question, Persuade, Refer) suicide prevention.
- ★ There were 6,357 unique visitors to the website in the last year. Over 4,800 people read the monthly e-newsletter. A new online AODA class with 53 participants from 34 schools and organizations was offered for the first time.
- ★ With Federal Emergency Management funding through the DPI, 11 PREPaRE and 2 regional Readiness and Emergency Management trainings were held throughout the state.



2015-2016 Trainings

Trainings were held in all 12 CESAs and online. **Eight-hundred ninety-one educators** were trained in Educating Mindfully, Emerging Drug Trends, Youth Mental Health First Aid, Restorative Practices, Second Step, Suicide Prevention, School Safety (PREPaRE), and School SBIRT. Participants were from **170** school districts and **56** individuals or organizations. *See the Participant Map below*. According to workshop evaluations 99.6% strongly agreed or agreed the training met their needs and they will use strategies presented to have a positive impact on student learning and 99.2% would recommend the training to others.

Having to cancel workshops has been a challenge for the statewide training center over the last 4 years. Predicting when school staff can attend trainings is difficult. We do our best to plan events at the best possible dates when meeting rooms and presenters are available. We have learned it is best to avoid the beginning and end of the school year (September and May). We use our assessment results to plan events that meet school staff needs.

Technical Assistance

Technical assistance is offered by email, phone, and through partnerships with CESAs holding share-shops/networking meetings. Shareshops were held in every CESA, offering networking updates, education, and promotion of WISH Center events and technical assistance. Several shareshops included roll out of the WI School Mental Health Framework in the spring of 2016. WISH Center Staff presented at 3 statewide conferences and reached a total of **143** people.

Statewide Conferences/Presentation:

QPR Training

In 2015-2016, we trained **712 youth, school staff, and community members in QPR** (Question, Persuade, Refer) suicide prevention. This is the first year that we have provided QPR using our base grant funds due to the finish of the grant with Mental Health America of Wisconsin. Training were held in 17 schools/organizations: Arrowhead, CESA #6 RITE Candidates, CESA #9 Board of Control, Door County-Project 180, Gibraltar, Greenfield, Hortonville, Kaukauna, Lake Holcombe (2), New Auburn, Oshkosh Police Department, Rib Lake, Ripon, Shawano, Stanley-Boyd, Stratford, and Three Lakes.


Newsletters

We use Constant Contact to maintain our contact list of **1,781** active contacts. Our newsletter is developed and emailed out through Constant Contact so we can track readership and see what links people are following. We had **4,820** opens of the monthly e-newsletter. Our average open rate of 33.1% is much greater than the average education open rate of 21.3%. Our average click rate on articles is 17% (810 clicks) compared to the education average of 10%. Website

There were **6,357** unique visitors to the website from July 1, 2015-June 30, 2016. This was 898 more than the previous year rate of 5,459 unique visitors. There were a total of 27,153 pageviews. 66% were new visitors. We will continue to add resources and make our website more interactive as well as use social media, Twitter and Facebook to promote our website and newsletter.



Other Technical Assistance and Growing Capacity

We spent time this year assisting the DPI in coordinating the 2015 Building the Heart Conference and planning the 2016 Conference. WISH Center staff contacted keynote and sectional presenters and created the conference program. We will continue coordinating and planning the 2016 BHSS Conference.

WISH Center Staff developed and facilitated an Online AODA Basic Course twice this year with 53 participants from 34 school districts using the Moodle platform for learning. Every year we try to develop an online resources related to safe and health schools that is available "on demand" for people who are not able to leave work to attend professional development.

WISH Center Staff continue to focus on growing the capacity of the Center. We will be offering purchased services for 2016-2017 for QPR, Youth Mental Health First Aid, School SBIRT, PREPaRE training, giving schools and communities options for bringing a training to them for a cost recovery fee.

Technical Assistance

We continue to meet the needs of local schools by providing as much technical assistance as our time allows. Due to limited time and travel, most TA is provided by email or phone. We record TA using a Google form to track services provided by WISH Center Staff. This was our first full year of recording technical assistance in this way. We provided technical assistance to 2,706 people. It varied from a 15 minute phone call to an all-day training or meeting. This is a difficult area to track and quantify in a report.

Reports are listed below by WISH Center staff member. Some key areas for technical assistance include: assisting schools with YRBS administration and reporting, providing support for school SBIRT implementation, and supporting DPI projects such as Youth Mental Health First Aid, NIJ Bullying Prevention grantees, Trauma Sensitive Schools project, and the WI School Mental Health Framework roll out. The Regional Coordinators also spend time building relationships with CESA staff in their regions.

Event Evaluations

Overall, workshop satisfaction was great. PREPaRE training evaluations were sent directly to NASP (National Association of School Psychologists) per the trainer requirements. According to workshop evaluations 99.6% strongly agreed or agreed the training met their needs and they will use strategies presented to have a positive impact on student learning and 99.2% would recommend the training to others.
