Good Drugs Gone Bad: A train-the-trainer workshop on prescription drug abuse prevention

Prescription drug abuse is an epidemic, cutting across geographic, racial, ethnic and socioeconomic boundaries. Two-thirds (65 percent) of teens who abuse prescription painkillers say they got them from family members and friends (NSDUH, 2010).

Eighteen percent of Wisconsin high school students have reported taking a prescription drug without a doctor's prescription (2011 Wisconsin Youth Risk Behavior Survey)

Teens don't see this behavior as risky. They see their parents taking medicine—and they believe that since medicine is created and tested in a scientific environment it is therefore safer to use than street drugs.

Come and learn about the real dangers of prescription and over-the-counter (OTC) drug abuse.

Learning Objectives—Participants will:

- Learn about the growing problem of prescription drug and OTC drug abuse.
- Become familiar with emerging drug trends.
- Experience using the Good Drugs Gone Bad Toolkit.
