PREPaRE 1 - Crisis Prevention and Preparedness

Comprehensive School Safety Planning

This 1-day workshop provides school mental health professionals, administrators, security officers, and other educators knowledge and resources important to establishing and sustaining comprehensive, ongoing school safety and crisis prevention, mitigation, and preparedness. Making use of existing personnel, resources, and programs, PREPaRE can be adapted to a school's needs and size. Specific attention is given to developing, exercising and evaluating safety/crisis teams and plans, and integrating school and community crisis response personnel. Also addressed are issues associated with the media, social media, technology, students with special needs, culture, and memorials. Training reinforces improved school climate, student behavior and academic functioning, student resilience, and school staff crisis response capabilities.



TRAINING: A PROFESSIONAL LEARNING EXPERIENCE

PREPaRE 1 (one-day) Focuses on Crisis Planning

- Provides a broad overview of the school safety and crisis team's roles and responsibilities, with a special emphasis on crisis prevention and preparedness.
- Demonstrates an overall checklist of needs for environmental and psychological safety
- Target audience: any school professional or community provider/agency who serves on a crisis team and/or is involved in establishing or promoting school safety.

PREPaRE 1 reinforces improved school climate, student behavior and academic functioning, student resilience, and school staff crisis response capabilities.

- COACHING SUPPORT Individual or Team Coaching with a WISH Trainer for post event debriefing or safety tabletop exercises
