PREPare 2 - Mental Health Crisis Interventions

Responding to an Acute Traumatic Stressor in Schools

The third edition of this PREPaRE workshop develops the knowledge and skill required to provide immediate mental health crisis interventions to the students, staff, and school community members who have been simultaneously exposed to an acute traumatic stressor. The knowledge and skill developed within this session also helps to build a bridge to the psychotherapeutic and trauma ND CRISIS informed mental health response sometimes required to address challenges associated with trauma exposure.





TRAINING: A PROFESSIONAL LEARNING EXPERIENCE

The 2-day PREPaRE 2 workshop builds the knowledge and skills necessary to meet the mental health needs of students and staff in the aftermath of a crisis. This workshop will help participants:

- Report reduced anxiety and fear associated with the provision of school mental health crisis interventions
- Report increased knowledge and confidence associated with the provision of school mental health crisis interventions
- Identify variables that help to estimate the number of individuals traumatized by a crisis
- Recognize the difference between common crisis reactions and mental illness
- Identify the elements of school crisis preparedness specified by the PREPaRE acronym
- Recognize risk factors that predict psychological trauma
- Identify the warning signs that indicate psychological trauma
- Place PREPaRE mental health crisis interventions on a multitiered continuum. ranging from least to most restrictive
- Match the degree of psychological trauma risk to the appropriate school crisis interventions.

KEY ACTIONS FOR EFFECTIVE IMPLEMENTATION

- Have an Incident Command System in place (Safety & Crisis Team)
- Have an Emergency **Operations Plan**



- COACHING SUPPORT Individual or Team Coaching with a WISH Trainer for post event debriefing or safety tabletop exercises
- ADDITIONAL RESOURCES FOR REVIEW
