Parents Need to Know

- ☑ Parents who give alcohol to their teen's friends under any circumstances, even in their own homes, are breaking the law.
- ☑ Parents who knowingly allow a person under 21 to remain in their home or on their property while consuming or possessing alcoholic beverages can be prosecuted and everything associated with such a violation can be confiscated, including person property.
- ☑ Parents can be sued if they give alcohol to anyone under 21 and they in turn hurt someone, hurt themselves or damage property.
- ☑ Underage drinking can cause serious health and safety consequences.

Tips for Parents

- ☑ Host safe, alcohol-free activities for youth during prom and graduation season
- ☑ Refuse to supply alcohol to anyone under 21
- ☑ Be at home when your teen has a party
- ☑ Make sure your teenager's friends do not bring alcohol into your home
- ☑ Talk to other parents about not providing alcohol at youth events
- ☑ Report underage drinking to law enforcement
