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How Social Media is Affecting Our Kids

- Creates Anxiety
- Lowers Self Esteem
- Easier to be Cruel
- Health Issues



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Disadvantages from social networking on students:

- Encourages exploitation and abuse
- Behavioral tendencies and consequences
- Health conditions



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Staggering Numbers

- 100,000 instances of Child Pornography reported on 1,194 separate social networks on the web.
- Since 2002 140 million images of child pornography have been submitted to Law Enforcement.
- Since 1998, the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children (NCMEC) Cyber Tipline has reported over 5.1 million instances of child exploitation.
- In the last 12 years, this has resulted in over 40,000 arrests.
- 33% of the Internet is poronographic!

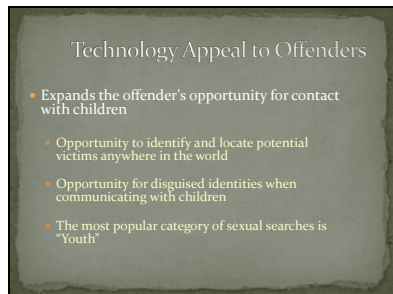
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Stage 2: Gaining Victims Trust

- Predators want to gather as much information on a victim as they can to learn their tendencies, their likes and wants, and where the vulnerabilities are
- Social media profiles give ample information about interests in movies, music, location information, etc.

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Stage 3: Filling a Need


- Predators want to become idealized by buying gifts, giving a lot of compliments and personal attention to the victim



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Stage 4: Isolating the Victim

- Getting the child alone allows the predator to cultivate a special relationship
- Meeting at special events, babysitting, tutoring, mentoring, and coaching are all used to get this "alone time"



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Stage 5: Sexualizing the Relationship

- After trust and dependence are gained predators can become more aggressive when it comes to sexualizing this new relationship
- Predators want to shape the child's sexual preferences
- Use sex and excitement to fuel the relationship and keep child interested
- Child subsequently comes to see themselves as mature and special

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Stage 6: Maintaining Control

- Predators keep children silent about the abuse by using...
 - Threats
 - Blame
 - Humiliation
 - Fear
 - Manipulation
 - Emotional Dependency

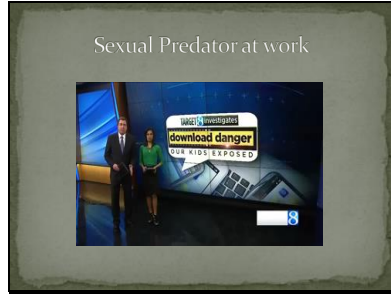
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Stage 6: Maintaining Control

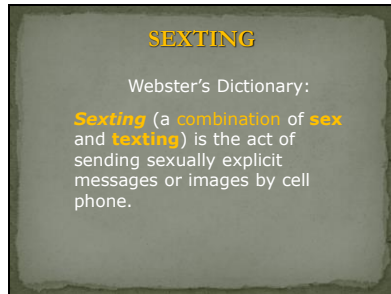


Our cases usually end with this type of control...

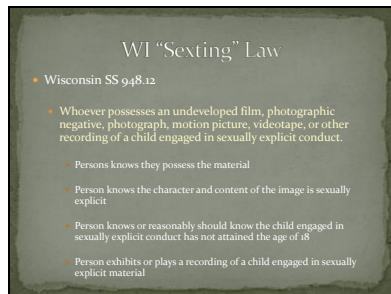
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This one action can result in multiple felonies in less than a minute.

- Sending it is distribution of child pornography.
- Everyone who keeps the photo on his or her phone could be charged with possession of child pornography.

- Call police for any inappropriate contact or behaviors

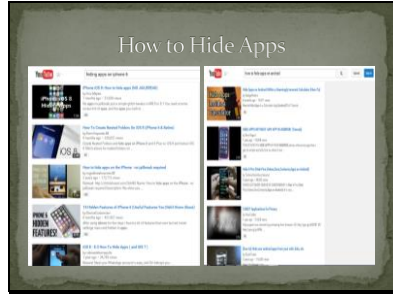

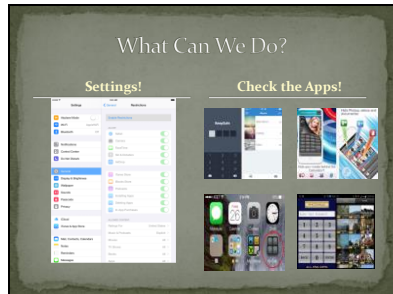

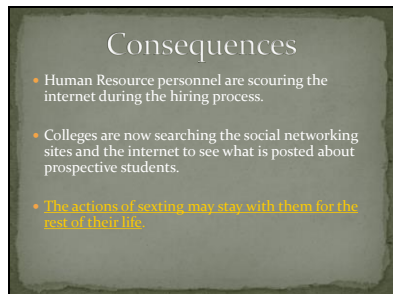

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Cellular Monitoring

- Life 360
 - Runs on mobile device
 - You are in Control!
 - You family members on a map
 - Communicate with family members
 - Receive alerts when family arrives at home, work or school
 - Check in for quick updates
 - You can control your own location and turn on and off at your convenience.



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Cellular Monitoring

- **Mobile Spy**-Records phone logs, text messages, e-mail, photos, videos, sites visited, GPS and uploads data to online account via the Internet. User does not know it's there.
- **My Mobilewatchdog.org** – Basically the same as Mobile Spy, but the user does know it is there.
- **Cell Phone Providers**- Various programs and software
